The purpose of Mission Possible is **equipping the next generation of Christ-centered leaders.** This is the *end*, the purpose, the goal of any trip that is taken. The trip's end or ultimate purpose is not to build a school, paint a fence, provide healthcare, or teach masonry. Each of these things is a wonderful, good, and necessary *means* to the end of equipping leaders.

There is a child in Haiti that will miss his or her opportunity to be a leader without a Mission Possible school. There is a person in the Dominican Republic (DR) who will not be allowed to rise to leadership without the safety provided by a fenced in property. There are future leaders who will suffer and perhaps die without proper health services. There is a family, from which a future leader will come, who will survive by one of its members learning the masonry trade.

Mission Possible is the Ace Hardware (or choose your favorite hardware store) for leadership in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Ace doesn't come and fix your toilet, or pound the nail. It doesn't mow your yard, or paint your family room. Ace Hardware provides the necessary tools and supplies for the job. It provides the *means* for you to accomplish the *end* result. Home Depot says, "You can do it. We can help." Mission Possible and your participation in this ministry team provide the necessary tools and supplies for the leaders and teachers in Haiti and the DR to do the job of leadership development.

Kurt Bishop, past-president of Mission Possible, once said, "Just think. The next president of Haiti or the DR could be in one of our schools today." Yes, just think, leadership throughout Haiti and the DR can be changed through the work of God, Mission Possible, and the other leadership development ministries in these countries. And yes, just think, you are going to be a part of that leadership toolbox.

Mission Possible seeks more than putting Christian leaders in the Haitian government. Mission Possible is about Christ-centered leadership. So primary to the development of leaders comes the discipleship of the spirit through the Spirit. As you will hear from our national leaders Herve Pierre and Moise Sam, growing Christ-centered followers of the one Lord and God is the chief end of our mission.

This chief end is based on the biblical commands and commission of Jesus Christ.

Matthew 22:34-40, "Hearing that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, the Pharisees got together. One of them, an expert in the Law tested him with this question. Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law? Jesus replied: **Love the Lord** your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it, **Love your neighbor** as yourself. All the Law and Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Matthew 28:19-20, "Therefore, go and **make disciples** of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the earth!" Spiritual leaders may end up as president. However, many live ordinary lives as extraordinary leaders in the hands of God.
